3 Sep – Tideswell v Baslow* 16 Sep –Duckmanton Lodge v Tideswell Baslow 168-1, TCC 155-5 TCC 87, D'manton L. 88-3

A season much affected by rain, despite July's heat, ended with a whimper at Calow as Tides well collapsed on a slow pitch to some fairly average bowling. The home side, a friendly bunch, weren't crowing either as they had just heard that their ground, along with the 19th century ironmaster's house from which they take their name, was soon to be sold for development.

As this land is owned by a branch of the civil service, one can only laugh at the present government's pretence that it is encouraging sport in this country. We are forever being told of Awards for All and other Sport England grants: just try to lay your hands on this money to keep your sport going. True, Tideswell obtained its Sports Complex courtesy of Sport England, but none of the available funding can go towards the *upkeep* of such grand facilities.


Recently we were encouraged by DDDC to nominate volunteers who have put in exceptional effort to support a sports club – for some cheap award and a short speech of thanks from a council representative, who probably earns a salary adequate to pay for a small team of groundsmen for writing wheelie bin risk assessments. Better to do something useful for the club than waste time turning out for the presentation, really.

Meanwhile we keep playing cricket, against the odds. And the odds were all against TCC in their last home match. The number of overs had to be trimmed to 25 because of persistent rain, and Baslow, thanks to a quick-fire 57 from Tony Sadler, managed a competitive total. A captain's innings of 85* from Dave Waining brought Tides-well reasonably close, but the conditions were getting worse all the time and both teams were glad to finish this one.

At Calow, player availability restricted the Tideswell team to just 9. John Goddard and Andy Stelling took Tideswell to 64 with no apparent difficulty, but when Stelling was bowled by an exceptionally slow ball, the rest fell like dominoes, almost everyone holing out off Calvert's bowling. One exception was Tom Bent (3*), who, remarkably, has not been out once in 6 trips to the middle this summer. It was also good to see Andy's son Jack Stelling enjoying a full match. There was never much doubt about the result, although some tidy bowling by Tideswell ensured that it took 31 overs to get there.

With cricket over for the summer, TCC looks ahead to its AGM and the Annual Dinner before Christmas, and winter nets after New Year. A new venue is being sought for nets following a change in arrangements at Buxton Community School.

There have been reports that organised groups are collecting clothes for a bogus charity and then selling them on for personal gain.

Leaflets are distributed prior to a collection and a bogus charity number is used. If you receive a leaflet and have any concerns please keep the leaflet and contact the Police on 0845 123 33 33.

During the last two weeks, there have been several reports of burglaries when one person distracts the householder whilst an accomplice steals personal belongings. One example was when the offenders, in order to gain access to the property, said that they were from the waterboard They told the householder that there was a problem with the drains and that it was necessary to run the water until the dye came through. One man stayed in the kitchen with the householder whilst the other one stole from another room.

In other instances offenders have asked occupants to check their money as they say that they have observed their houses being broken into.

Some offences are believed to be linked to a silver Skoda estate car, displaying various registration plates on different sightings.

A decision has yet to be made by County Prosecuting solicitor who will decide if they, together with their parents are to be summoned before the Magistrates at the Juvenile Court at Chesterfied.

Please remember that these incidents have been committed by a very very small minority, and does not reflect the excellent behaviour displayed by the majority of youth in Tideswell.

The multi agency partnership Tideswell steering group which was set up in October 2003 has been nominated for the national "Taking a stand award" from the Respect Task Force, a national organisation set up to tackle anti social behaviour. The group has received £1000 and a number of articles will be circulating in the local press which describes the groups achievements in more detail.







GREEN WHEELIE BINS NOW TAKE MORE



TIDESWELL LADIES DARTS & DOMINOES LEAGUE

Although China tea-cups and Church Halls may not sound like a Darts & Dominoes venue I can assure you that is where one of the first Ladies Darts matches was played.

It all started off way back in the mid 1970's with Tideswell Women's Institute being challenged to a game by Bakewell W.I. This game was actually played at the Monsal Head but Tideswell then went on to play games as far away as Wildboarclough, that being the one played in a Church Hall, although I must admit it was a race against time to get the last game finished before closing time at the nearby pub !!!

Wynn Duffield the landlady of The Star Inn was a W.I. Member. Being in the 70's, or maybe just because we were "The W.I.", whatever the reason, we gathered in The Star once a week to practice - BEFORE opening time. When The Star opened its doors at 8p.m. we all went home!! Can you believe it ?

As time went by organizations such as The Young Wives, Litton Horticultural Society along with all the pubs in Tideswell got together to form the Tideswell Ladies Darts League. Dominoes was added as an extra attraction a few years later. Over the next 10/15 years the League flourished. In its heyday 60 or more ladies would gather in the Ex-Servicemen's Club for "Memorial Night" and "Finals Night".

On Finals Night the Snooker Table could be heard to groan with the weight of Trophies and on Memorial Night a charity fundraising was held for charities with women and children in mind.

Sadly, these last few years have seen numbers dwindle, so much so that the League has now closed.

A meeting was held in the George Hotel where a few players heard Treasurer Joyce Allen give her report. A final balance of $\pounds 148.52$ is to be donated to Ashgate Hospice. The Secretary Diedre Slack reported that any Trophy donated would be returned to the family concerned. All that remained was for the Chairman Margaret Lingard to finally close the meeting at 8.45p.m. on Tuesday 26th September 2006.
